


The **High School Academic Progress Evaluations** tool measures a high school student's progress toward graduation and a diploma. Formerly referred to as the College and Career Readiness Evaluation, high school counselors can work with students who are using this new tool to help prepare them for college, industry-based certificates, and specific careers. Any public high school student in Florida may use this free online evaluation.

1 Getting started

Accessing the evaluation is quick and easy:


1. Go to **FloridaShines.org**
2. Select **Go To College**
3. Choose **Get Ready for College** from the drop-down menu.
4. Then click **Start Your High School Academic Progress Evaluation** to begin.
5. **Log in** with your school district, student's last name, and the Student Identifier Number (SIN) assigned to the student by your school. If an SIN has not been assigned, the student's SSN, followed by an X (123456789X), may be used.



2 Selecting an evaluation

Use the dropdown menu to select an evaluation and the check student's progress:

- **Standard:** Credits and achievements toward a standard diploma.
- **Career:** Credits and achievements toward a standard diploma, and to prepare for a career or an industry-based certification exam.
- **College:** Credits and achievements toward a standard diploma, and to meet the requirements for admission to one of Florida's public universities.
- **College and Career:** Credits and achievements toward a standard diploma, to meet the requirements for admission to one of Florida's public universities, and to prepare for a career or an industry-based certification exam.



Interpreting the information

The tabs at the top of the screen provide detailed information based on the evaluation that you selected from the dropdown menu:

“My Progress” provides a quick, all-in-one look at the student’s progress. A gauge approximates the overall progress the student has made toward meeting the various requirements for graduation.



“Achievements” displays academic and extra-curricular components that are in addition to course credits required for the selected evaluation. Examples include components required for university admissions or industry certification exams.

✓	Online Course Earn course credit in at least one through online learning. This requirement may be met through an online course offered by Florida Virtual School (FVS), an online course offered by the high school, or an online dual enrollment course. This requirement does not apply if you are a student pursuing the 16-credit Academically Challenging Curriculum to Enhance Learning (ACCEL) option.

“Courses Taken” is a chronological list of all courses the student has taken. Not all courses may be used by the evaluation. “Subject Area” identifies where the course was applied on the evaluation. Subject Area is coded on the transcript by the school.

“GPA Requirements” identifies the minimum GPA required to graduate from high school. This screen also provides the GPA profiles of each of Florida’s 40 public colleges and universities.

“Assessments” displays the student’s highest score in each subject area, as reported to the Florida Department of Education by the ACT, SAT, and/or PERT testing source. Results for each subject area may originate from different test dates.

Assessment for College and Career Entry


Students starting out in college or a career need to be well prepared. Your performance on various tests may help determine whether additional preparation may be necessary prior to graduation.

The ACT college-ready cut scores are: English 17, Math 19, and Reading 19.
The PERT college-ready cut scores are: Writing 103, Math 114, and Reading 106.
The SAT-I college-ready cut scores are: Verbal 440 and Math 440.

“College and Career Ready” displays a summary of the student’s academic record, and compares it with the requirements for admission into each of Florida’s public universities. Parents, teachers, and counselors can use this information when advising the student, and to help the student set and achieve academic and career goals.



“Course Requirements” lists required credits for the selected evaluation, credits applied, and credits remaining. Based on state graduation requirements; districts may have additional requirements.
